New BuscaPlantasPR.com website offers opportunity to increase Zingiberales use in Puerto Rican landscaping

On October 31, 2011, Bokeana Corporation, a nursery and landscape contractor from Hormigueros, Puerto Rico, launched their new website www.BuscaPlantasPR.com.

The site combines a plant search engine with a supplier directory and availability tool that enables its users, primarily landscape designers and contractors, to perform searches based on specific plant categories, growth, growing environment, maintenance requirements, characteristics, uses and special features. It can be accessed free of charge for basic functionality by hobbyists and plant enthusiasts/collectors, but requires the users to register.

Besides the search capabilities for plants, the site allows subscribed



users advanced search capabilities that allow them to find local suppliers that are selling the plants



commercially on the island.

The development of this website took one year from specs to launch. It required a parallel effort in designing and programming a database for the web, plus a team dedicated to documenting plant information from reputable sources and photographing the plants.

The plant information provided on the website has as its intended audience landscape architects, landscapers and plant enthusiasts, so it focuses less on taxonomical aspects and more on ornamental features of the plants, proper environ-

ment for growing them, and cultivation. Since the information is intended for local landscapers and enthusiasts, a decision was made to provide the information in Spanish. The team made a great effort in ensuring the latest scientific names were used in the database by verifying each plant's name in the International Plants Name Index (IPNI) and the-plantlist.org website, which are the key sources for correct nomenclature. The team also made sure that all the plants in the database are either in cultivation or have been cultivated in the past in Puerto Rico.

As of the launch date, the website had a total of 1,120 plants documented, but Bokeana plans to continue adding plants and continue improving the content provided. Out of the total number of plants documented to date, the website offers information for the following Zingiberales: 102 Heliconia, 6 Alpinia, 4 Musa, 2 Hedychium, 2 Curcuma, 1 Dichorisandra, 1 Tapeinochilos, 1 Costus sp., 1 Zingiber, 1 Monocostus, 2 Ensete, 2 Etlingera, 3 Canna, and 3 Strelitzia, for a total of 131 varieties or 11.6% of the total number of plants listed. The

team plans to continue documenting varieties and cultivars, to make sure these plants are more widely known and used in landscaping.

Since the users of this site are likely to be people interested in plants, the site offers a free events announcement calendar, where organizations such as HSPR can announce their meetings and educational activities, so that interested website users can attend. When an event is entered it is reviewed by the website administrator and if approved it will be posted on the global calendar which is visible by all users of the site.

We hope this article motivates all members of HSPR to register on our site and help develop the content that is related to Zingiberales. The BuscaPlantasPR.com team still needs to work on photography and information for many Zingiberales varieties so if you are interested in offering help, please feel free to contact me on 787-399-0120 or via e-mail at: admin@buscaplantaspr.com (Ing.
